# Get involved in naming the new streets in Collyhurst Village

**Do you want to be involved in Collyhurst history and leave your mark on the community? Are you always coming up with lots of great ideas?**

Now is your chance to unleash your creativity and get involved in naming the new streets in Collyhurst Village!

We want you, or teamed together with family and friends, to come up with the names for our new streets within our brand new development in Collyhurst Village.

## Collyhurst Phase One development

Part of the Victoria North regeneration programme, the Collyhurst Phase One development is the first big investment in the area for many years.

Now starting to take shape on two sites in Collyhurst Village and in Collyhurst South are 274 energy-efficient new homes, a shop, community space and a new park. 130 of the new homes will be council-owned homes for social rent, meaning they will be affordable to as many people as possible.

The new homes will be a mix of townhouses and apartments, with something for everyone - including families, young working people and older residents - as we create a sustainable neighbourhood for current and future generations.

As part of the first phase of development at Collyhurst Village, we're also going to create a new park in the heart of the neighbourhood for everyone to enjoy. New Collyhurst Park will provide green spaces to sit and relax, wildflower areas and water features as well as play spaces with a range of children's play equipment.



## The new streets

As shown in the plan below, there are six new streets being created as part of the Collyhurst Village Phase One development.



## The competition

We want you to get your thinking caps on and come up with the six new street names for the first phase of development in Collyhurst Village.

You can either submit your entry individually or team up with family members, friends or neighbours to come up with names for the new streets.

After the competition closes on Tuesday 5 September 2023, the top entries will be shortlisted and chosen by a panel of judges.

If any of your ideas are selected, as well as securing your place in Collyhurst history, you will be invited to attend a ceremony to unveil the new street signs.

## Further guidance

The street names submitted will be reviewed against Manchester City Council's street naming criteria, which are as follows:

- New street names should not duplicate any name already in use within the city, including areas adjoining neighbouring authorities. A variation in the terminal word, for example, "Street", "Road", "Avenue", will not be accepted as sufficient reason to duplicate a street name.
- New street names must not include a number.
- Street names must not begin with the word 'The'.
- Street names must not contain any punctuation of any kind.
- Street names should not be difficult to pronounce or awkward to spell as these may lead to confusion in an emergency situation.
- In order to avoid causing offence either by inclusion or exclusion, no street will be named after any living person or after someone who passed away within the last five years.
- Names that promote a company, service or product will not be allowed.
- Street names must not have a Royal connection unless special permission is obtained.
- Street names that may be considered to be offensive will not be acceptable.
